HAPPY NEW YEAR

The directors and staff of the Canadian Association of Movers wish members a happy, successful and prosperous new year. Your Association had a busy and successful year in 2006:

- Membership grew by 14% in 2006.
- The Association referred over 1,000 moves to members and dealt with 250 complaints.
- The Certified Canadian Mover Program provided members with a useful tool for validating their reputation with consumers.
- We hosted our 2006 annual conference, with attendees stating that the presenters were the best ever.
- The Association expanded its media presence through national press releases and appearances on radio and television and in newspapers.

NEW HOURS-OF-SERVICE REGULATIONS

Members are reminded that the new hours-of-service regulations came into effect on January 1, 2007. While the regulations were made by the federal government, all provinces have agreed to enforce them. The regulations can be seen in full in the Canada Gazette on the web, at <http://canadagazette.gc.ca/partII/2005/20051116/html/sor313-e.html>.

The new regulations can significantly change the manner in which your drivers operate. A few highlights that you should be aware of are:

- The regulations apply to commercial vehicles over 4,500 kg.
- The regulations are based on a 24-hour work and rest cycle.
- "Day" is defined as "a 24-hour period that begins at the hour designated by a motor carrier and is maintained for the duration of the cycle." Start time of the day can only be changed after a cycle reset of 36 or 72 hours.
- 10 hours off-duty time must be taken daily.
- No driver shall drive after accumulating:
 1. 13 hours of driving time
 2. 14 hours of on-duty time
- New work shift starts when a driver reports for duty, after having taken at least 8 consecutive hours of off-duty.

- Within the work shift, no driver shall drive after accumulating:
 1. 13 hours of driving time
 2. 14 hours of on-duty time
 3. 16 hours of elapsed time
- When any of these limits are reached, the driver must take a minimum of 8 consecutive hours off-duty before starting to drive again.

ONTARIO'S HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT

Members should be aware that carriage of household goods is no longer regulated by the *Truck Transportation Act*.

The *Highway Traffic Act* now regulates the carriage of household goods and lays out the Uniform Conditions of Carriage – Household Goods under Schedule 3. There are minor changes to the information, but if you are planning to print new bills of lading, you should consider updating the conditions of carriage on the back and ensuring that you have the correct required information on the front. Other provinces' Uniform Conditions of Carriage – Household Goods will be posted to CAM's website later this month.

PRESS RELEASES

For the last three years, the Canadian Association of Movers has been issuing press releases two or three times each year. Their themes relate to such topics as the importance of hiring a CAM member as your mover and various methods to avoid the less-than-reputable mover. These press releases have resulted in many positive moving-industry stories and interviews on TV, radio and in daily and weekly newspapers.

We will issue two more in the next few days. One will be directed at hiring students as summer staff to fill your needs for temporary workers. The other will give consumers the following five DOs and five DON'Ts about how to find and hire a reputable mover to take care of their needs during the busy summer moving season.

DOs

1. Use a reputable mover. Check with your provincial government, the Better Business Bureau and, especially, CAM (at www.mover.net/consumers.html or toll-free 1-866-860-0065).
2. Always make sure you get your estimate IN WRITING.
3. Read Industry Canada's *Consumer Checklist for Choosing a Moving Company*.*
4. Ask how your goods will be physically protected and insured while in transit.
5. Visit the mover's physical location; that is, their office or warehouse.

DON'Ts

1. Rely on advertised or verbal promises.
2. Make your decision based solely on price.
3. Accept any agreement not supported in writing.
4. Assume the mover is insured.
5. Assume that the mover you contract with will be the one you move with.

CONDITIONS OF CARRIAGE

As mentioned last month, CAM posted the current Conditions of Carriage for all provinces except Quebec (which we will post shortly), and Newfoundland and Labrador and Prince Edward Island (which do not have them). The Conditions of Carriage should be current on the backs of your bills of lading.

Paul Kenwood passed away on March 15, 2007. He established Kenwood Moving and Storage in Montreal and served as president of Allied Van Lines during the 1960s. Paul chaired many van-line, industry and agent committees and was instrumental in creating the foundation of the van-line and agent policies and procedures that remain in use today. His children serve in the moving industry today.

AMERICAN MOVING AND STORAGE ASSOCIATION – 2007 CONVENTION AND TRADE SHOW

In late April, John Levi, president of CAM, attended AMSA's 2007 convention and trade show. One of the objectives of the convention was to wish Joe Harrison well in retirement. Joe retired after serving the moving industry for 26 years. He led the moving industry through the mergers of the Household Goods Carriers' Bureau and the American Movers Conference and then between the American Movers Conference and the National Moving and Storage Association to finally create the American Moving and Storage Association. He is responsible for developing much of the recent mover- and consumer-related regulations. CAM thanks Joe for his friendship and support and wishes him well in his retirement.

Joe has been succeeded as president by Linda Bauer Darr. Ms. Darr comes to AMSA from the American Bus Association, the US Department of Transportation, and the North American Transportation Alliance. She has excellent qualifications for the position and demonstrated a passion for moving in her address to attendees at the convention. CAM wishes her success in her new position and looks forward to maintaining the close relationship between our two associations.

The convention had some excellent content. A couple of presentations to note were:

- A panel discussion, "Industry Trends: Including Container/Trailer Customer Load and Unload Services":
The panel discussed the value of both mover-serviced and consumer-loaded portable moving/storage containers. They felt that this might be one area where the traditional mover would face new competition. It might also present an opportunity for movers where there were labour shortages. They talked about the importance of demystifying the pricing structure to give the consumer pricing that was easier to understand.
- A presentation by John Hill, Administrator, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration:
Mr. Hill discussed the improvements in highway safety in the USA, initiatives in monitoring driver health and unified commercial-driver's licence data to ensure that all jurisdictions are aware of any medical risk or infractions a driver might have. FMCSA will develop the National Consumer Complaints Registry. It was obvious in the presentation that AMSA had developed a great relationship with government.

Smooth Move

Every year, the Canadian Association of Movers (CAM) hears from hundreds of Canadians who have been victimized by movers. If you make the right decisions *before* you move, you'll save money, prevent damage and avoid frustration and heartache. Here are some basic suggestions from CAM.

- Use a reputable mover. Contact the Better Business Bureau or CAM for referrals. Go to www.mover.net/consumers.html or call 1-866-860-0065 for information.
- Get your estimate in writing. Abuses arise when there is nothing in writing, including low-balling an estimate and then demanding double or triple the amount before delivery, a company that's a no-show on moving day, damage to goods and refusal to pay insured amounts.
- Visit the mover's place of business to ensure the business exists. Too often, a mover operates with a cell phone only and can never be found after the move.

And remember, the lowest price does not always yield an economical move. Good moves are delivered only by good movers. *Reprinted with permission of CARP magazine (May, 2007).*

EMPLOYING YOUNG WORKERS

Governments across Canada are becoming increasingly concerned with injuries to young and inexperienced workers. While the following information applies specifically to employers in BC, you should be aware that you have health and safety responsibilities when hiring students and young workers anywhere in Canada.

Every mover in Canada is scrambling to find staff for the summer rush. Ken Taylor at Kelowna Movers just sent us a notification from BC's Ministry of Labour and Citizens' Services.

"Every employer who will be hiring young workers (under 25 years of age) or new workers will need to know about WorkSafeBC's new Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) Regulation effective July 26, 2007, relating to the orientation and training requirements of young and new workers."

The BC government is offering seminars across the province to familiarize employers with their responsibilities under the regulations. Visit their website, at www.labour.gov.bc.ca/eao, for locations and times. Further, you can visit www.worksafebc.com for more information.

CAM'S STUDENT-WORKER PROGRAM

CAM has been advertising for student workers through university employment offices and has sent more than 100 résumés to members.

CANADA LABOUR CODE – OVERTIME RULES FOR CITY & HIGHWAY DRIVERS

We received a fax from HRSDC regarding a survey of movers that was done in the Ottawa area regarding overtime for drivers. It helps to define the difference between city and highway drivers. The *Motor Vehicle Operators Hours of Work Regulations* provides for two categories of operators:

- highway motor vehicle operators (highway drivers) who are entitled to overtime pay at time and a half after working 60 hours in a week; and,
- city motor vehicle operators (city drivers) who are entitled to overtime pay at time and a half after working either 9 hours in a day or 45 hours in a week.

The regulations state that a “highway motor vehicle operator” means a motor vehicle operator who is not a bus operator or a city motor vehicle operator.

The regulations also state that a “city motor vehicle operator” means a motor vehicle operator who operates exclusively within a 10-mile (16 km) radius of his home terminal and is not a bus operator and includes any motor vehicle operator who is classified as a city motor vehicle operator in a collective agreement entered into between his employer and a trade union acting on his behalf *or who is not classified in any such agreement but is considered to be a city motor vehicle operator according to the prevailing industry practice in the geographical area where he is employed* (emphasis added).

US HOURS OF SERVICE

The American Moving and Storage Association announced that the US Court of Appeals ruled that the FMCSA's increase of permissible driving time from 10 to 11 hours in a 14-hour on-duty time period was arbitrary and capricious. The Court also found that the agency had not adequately justified the 34-hour restart provision and ordered the agency to vacate those portions of the rules.

The bottom line of the proceedings is that the Court's ruling will not become effective for at least 52 days. Existing Hours of Service Rules, including the 11-hour daily driving time limit and the 34-hour restart provision, will remain in place until at least September 14, 2007.

This may apply to any US operations you have. CAM will provide an update as soon as it's available.

EMPLOYMENT

Many members reported that a labour shortage reduced their ability to service some opportunities this summer. CAM is currently working on several initiatives to assist. This summer we referred over one hundred students to members as part-time or summer workers. We are looking at ways to improve this and extend it beyond our current sources. In addition to our work in recruiting students, we have posted a generic job-opportunity ad on our website for van foremen/drivers. A student employment agency in the Toronto area has just joined CAM. This could be a source of additional labour for you.

SUCCESS AND SUCCESSION — CAM'S 2007 ANNUAL CONFERENCE
